- I. New SUB Naming Process - Derek Moore (AMS Vice-President, Administration)
 1. New Sub isn't going to be called the "New Sub"; Students get a say in what the name will be. Student suggestions were submitted; New Sub Committee looked through the suggestions and narrowed it down to the top 7; voting on the best name just ended earlier this week.
 2. Top 7 names: The Hub (The AMS Student Hub), The Centre (The AMS Student Life Centre), The Pavilion/The SLP (The AMS Student Life Pavilion), AMS Hall (The AMS Student Hall), The Station (The AMS Student Station), The Nest (The AMS Student Nest), The Centre (The AMS Student Community Centre)
 3. We need to decide if we want the words "AMS" and "Student" in there, or if having both is redundant. If we choose to have only one, we need to choose which is more important
 1. Maria: Having student in there may be good especially for international students, because everyone can identify with that
 2. Tony: Most people don't know what the AMS is or don't care
 3. Thea: the AMS is already associated with students so adding "student" in the title may be redundant
 4. Legal name will show up online, and the shortened name will be what students call it
 5. Five different entrances where we can put a sign with the name on it
 6. Tony: what is the AMS's goal for the name?
 1. Our goal is to make sure people know that this is the AMS's building and that we are different and a separate entity from UBC
 7. Graeme: I don't know why the "AMS Student Union Building" isn't on that list?
 1. You don't name your cat "cat". The building will be a student union building, so we don't want to name it that

2. Graeme: I think it won't make a difference whether or not you put "Student" and "AMS" in the title. You'll still have people not knowing what the AMS is and not caring, they'll only figure out if they want to.
8. Nil: why don't you sell the rights and keep the word "AMS" in there?
 1. AMS building is coming from student money (\$85 million; total building cost is \$106.7 million). In order for us to display the top donor, they'd theoretically have to contribute \$85 million. If we put someone else's name up there, there's a smaller chance that the AMS would be associated with the building
 2. Nil: students don't care that it's not named after them, they care if they get to pay less
 3. There hasn't been any push to sell the rights
 4. Tony: (reiterates Nil's last point)
9. John: Can we have one name that can tie in the swimming pool, the field, the bus loop, etc.
 1. Aquatic centre will be demolished and replaced with MacInnes field, in the grass section there will be a shopping centre and faculty housing, bus loop will be facing the new sub, new aquatic centre will be facing the sub and be across from the bus loop. In terms of naming opportunities, the biggest thing is going to be re naming the new complex
 2. John: it's going to be the base of a very new, highly used space; it would be cool if they were all tied in together with one name.
 3. John: I also think there should be an acronym in the name
10. Mark: For the name, is it all going to be the same size typing and font?
 1. We haven't decided that yet. Do you have suggestions?
 2. I just think that if the words "AMS" or "Student" are going to be really small text it doesn't really matter if we have them both because they're going to be left out of the name in end
11. Derek: It seems like everyone wants both "AMS" and "student" in the name
12. Derek: Which names do you like
 1. The name "The AMS Student Station" will be abbreviated as "the ASS", so not that one
 2. Need to make sure that the name isn't too long (Community Centre is too long)
 3. Graeme: SLP sounds pretty cool
 4. Will: SLP sounds like the hospital though, because part of our hospital is named that
 5. What about The Hall?
 6. Sounds like Brock hall or a lecture hall
 7. The Nest is cool and relevant; it has a homely connotation
 8. Ben G: it needs to be short and catchy
 9. Derek: Facebook identified that "The Nest" and "The Hub" were the most popular
13. Derek: What if we reopened voting? Is this the right list of names?
 1. Graeme: how are you going to do this differently than last time?
 2. Derek: Right now naming has a decent amount of attraction. There was an article written about it and everything. We would also redo the campaign and advertise more, especially with posters
 3. Graeme: Sounds good; watch the deadline though. Do you have a target turnout?
 4. We had about 1000 voters last vote; we'd like more than 1500, but we don't expect more than 3000
 5. John: do you think some people will be offended if we reopen and remove some of the names?

1. Got involved with this in the summer; the program is in its first year; there are 12 of us nationally
2. We are here to promote Google culture and products
3. Two projects that we're launching are: mentoring videos, launching November 4th; Free and Open project (Getting people aware that they have a free and open voice on the internet)
4. Involves myself, David Polsky, Christopher Rey, and a 4th year arts student
5. Event involves 105 Comm students; 9th floor; info session with Google; Introduces the 2 initiatives listed above
6. Event needs food. Took the proposal to the executive council initially; budget has been reduced to ask for \$3 for students. Want a veggie platter or something like that
7. This comes to 0.002% of the SPF budget

Discussion:

- Nil: This is a company info session; we don't fund these, the BCC and university does. It's not our mandate to do this; this is why the executives didn't approve this. It's not a path we would like to go down.
 - Graeme: 1) yes half of it is a Google information session, but the second half is a student initiative that will provide value for Sauder Students
- John: I'm very for this idea. It could have been advertised better, but it did sell out in 2 days. If we put up a banner we'll get recognition, and commerce students may be more inclined to go to future events. Special projects fund is for people with good ideas, and I think we should support them with this. If we put our money in now, later on it will come back to the students
- Thea: Executives turned down this funding based on the fact that we don't fund company info sessions; the BCC does that. Most of you seem to not go with this thinking. If you are deciding to fund this, I think we should fund the initial ask of 715 and have the logo, the banner and the nicer food
- Maria: I'm against this in principle in that if we would be setting a precedent here, and if we fund it now more people will be coming and asking for us to give them money for food in the future.
- Mark: I do see the reason why the executives turn it down; If we accept it it'll make it hard to turn others down. After the referendum we can see that most of the younger students don't see
